

E-resources and Digital Repository in Stanford East Asia Library and Stanford University Libraries

This presentation outlines Stanford Universities Libraries and its East Asia Library's (EAL) use of electronic resources and their digital projects. EAL has perpetual and irrevocable access rights for all electronic titles purchased, and relies on various ways to deliver its services: making digital copies of purchased files for storage in the Stanford Digital Repository and for usage by authorized users; vendor-provided online resources that allows for access via browser on and off campus; locally hosted electronic resources; and electronic resources accessed via online subscription. Currently, EAL is actively involved in the Google project that scans Chinese collection, and aims to provide online access to its special collections such as Chinese comic books, historical maps, and archive documents. EAL is a part of the Stanford University Libraries system, which provides technological, financial and infrastructural support to EAL's digital commitment.
