

## CV Summary - William (Bill) Nagle

William (Bill) Nagle is a Research Fellow in the School of Biological Sciences at The University of Auckland, New Zealand and is a member of the Invasive Species Specialist Group of the Species Survival Commission of the International Union for the Conservation of Nature. Bill works on invasive species management projects across a range of taxa in Pacific Island Countries and Territories with the Pacific Invasives Initiative, a programme of the Pacific Invasives Partnership which is a Working Group of the Pacific Roundtable for Nature Conservation. Bill has a background in agriculture and horticulture, directed a horticultural research station for the New Zealand Government and has taught in tertiary educational institutions in New Zealand and Papua New Guinea. This work led him to the invasive species management area of biodiversity conservation. He has helped develop training courses in botany and ecology for New York City teachers at The New York Botanical Garden. His interest now is in working with Pacific Island agencies to develop capacity for invasive species management.
