Aming Tu is professor of Buddhist Informatics and Vice President of Dharma Drum Buddhist College, Taiwan.

He is currently the chair of Archive and Database Section of TELDAP, National Science Council. Aming is also the director of “Tripitaka Catalogs” and “Buddhist Lexicographical Resources” projects of TELDAP.

Since 1994 Aming has been involved in the constructing of the Buddhist Electronic database, has contributed many Buddhist digital resources since then. From 1998 to 2006 he is the Executive Manager of Chinese Buddhist Electronic Text Association (CBETA), he is the Vice Director of CBETA now.
