Kuangti Li is an associate research fellow at Institute of History and Philology, Academia Sinica in Taiwan. He is also one of the faculty members at Institute of Anthropology, National Tsing-hwa University.

For years, his research interests mainly focus on the prehistoric settlement and subsistence patterns in Taiwan and its surrounding areas by using isotopic and zooarchaeological approaches. He is also interested in the research of environmental archaeology and topics with the relationship between diet and strategy of ancient food resources procurements. He has completed more than 20 years of archaeological field research in Taiwan. His most recent research is a two-year project of archaeological shellfish study using isotopic analysis to deal with the relationship between prehistoric people and his environment and their shellfish gathering strategy on the areas of both sides of Taiwan Strait. And the other one project is “Out of Taiwan? Testing Austronesian homeland models and dispersal routes through morphometric and Genetic Signatures of Domestic Pigs” with Professor Tsang, Cheng-hwa.
